## **New C-TEC Web Site Provides Access To Jobs, Training**

Job seekers and employers have a new on-line resource to help them succeed in today's changing labor market: the Champaign Technology and Employment Center's (C-TEC) newly launched Web site, <http://ctec.gochampaign.com>.

The Web site serves as a one-stop resource for free employment and job readiness services provided by C-TEC and its partner agencies. C-TEC, a service of the Champaign County Department of Job and Family Services (CCDJFS), is part of the five-county WorkPlus Regional One-Stop System, which also includes employment and business resources in Clark, Logan, Madison and Union counties.

"Our new Web site provides job seekers and employers a convenient, central point of access for employment and career and business development services provided by C-TEC and our partner agencies," said Marcia Bailey, CCDJFS and C-TEC administrator.

On the home page, visitors are welcomed by a "hot jobs" listing of featured employment opportunities. Job seekers can register and log in to view these positions, which have been posted by area businesses. A complete listing of job openings is available at the C-TEC office at the Champaign County Community Center, 1512 S. U.S. 68, Bay 14, Urbana.

The Web site also offers job search tips and information on C-TEC's job training, resume writing and career development services.

Employers can use the site to access valuable resources for business loans, marketing, financial planning, labor market information and training programs to help their employees gain high-tech skills. And employers can register on the site to post job openings.

The site includes information and links to the services of C-TEC's partner agencies: Champaign County Department of Job and Family Services, Ohio Department of Job and Family Services, the Adult Basic and Literacy Education (ABLE) program of Ohio Hi-Point Career Center, the Champaign County Literacy Council, Veteran Services, the Ohio Rehabilitation Services Commission, Bureau of Service for the Visually Impaired, and Experience Works.
